2. McGehee, Arkansas- This is a chance to partner with First-Pres' own Kenny Shaw and his church down in McGehee Arkansas. We will be building relationships with locals while serving through VBS, construction projects, and a variety of other opportunities.

Cost: \$350 Dates: July 13-21 For: Current 8th-12th graders

3. Serving Springs - Come and see the needs in Colorado Springs and be equipped to respond with the love of Christ. Through Serving Springs, youth will stay at First Pres and spend the week serving and building relationships with local partners. Together with Vanguard Church (and possibly other local congregations), we will also worship, learn, and share about how God is working in us and through us. This week will be a springboard for relationship and service beyond the mission week and equip our youth with a solid foundation of missional service before sending them out to other states or countries.
