

**Week 6: 1 Corinthians 3:1-17**  
**What? So what? and Now What?**  
**Questions for Reflection**

*These questions can be used at any time for a different approach to the Scripture. The passage is to be read out loud before each set of questions followed by some silence as the group reflects and listens for God's voice. Begin your time with prayer.*

**What?**

As you listen to the passage being read, and as you read it to yourself again, what do you hear God saying to you **personally**? What words or phrases or ideas stand out to you?

As you listen to the others in the group, what do you sense that God might be saying **to the group**? Are there any "threads" or themes that seem to arise?

**So what?**

What do you think the **implications** of what you heard may be **for your own personal life**? Where and how does it touch you--maybe a conviction, maybe an encouragement, maybe a new healthy challenge, maybe an invitation, etc.?

Where or how do you think there may be **implications for your group**? (You can probably begin to answer this only after you have gotten to know each other a bit more.) How about **for the church as a whole**--not only First Presbyterian Church, but even the wider church? What difference should these truths make in the life of the body of Christ?

**Now what?**

How might God be inviting or prompting you to **respond to Him personally**? How is He asking you to engage with Him? To walk with Him? To work with Him? To Rest with Him? To enjoy Him?

How is He inviting or prompting you to respond to the people and world around you? Where might He want you to go from here?

How might God be inviting or prompting you as a group, or First Presbyterian Church, or the church as a whole to do the things listed above?

What are the things you would like to do this coming week (and into the future) to respond to what you have heard from God tonight?1w
